The Theme of Today's Liturgy

If Our Lord kept a record of sins, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Him! (*Introit*) Therefore we beg the Lord today to hear the devout prayers of His Faithful people and grant us the forgiveness we desire (*Collect*). And with that forgiveness comes the courage to share that forgiveness with others – to forgive in the same way that we have been forgiven. For he who has begun a good work in you by His mercy will complete it in the day of Our Lord Jesus Christ (*Epistle*).

St. Matthew 18:23-35


- P The Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew, the eighteenth chapter.

At that time Jesus spoke this parable to His disciples: "The kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. And when he had begun to settle accounts, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. But as he was not able to pay, his master commanded that he be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and that payment be made. The servant therefore fell down before him, saying, 'Master, have patience with me, and I will pay you all.' Then the master of that servant was moved with compassion, released him, and forgave him the debt. But that servant went out and found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii; and he laid hands on him and took him by the throat, saying, 'Pay me what you owe!' So his fellow servant fell down at his feet and begged him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you all.' And he would not, but went and threw him into prison till he should pay the debt. So when his fellow servants saw what had been done, they were very grieved, and came and told their master all that had been done. Then his master, after he had called him, said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you begged me. Should you not also have had compassion on your fellow servant, just as I had pity on you?' And his master was angry, and delivered him to the torturers until he should pay all that was due to him. So My heavenly Father also will do to you if each of you, from his heart, does not forgive his brother his trespasses."
