THE THEME OF TODAY'S LITURGY

The Word of Life who was manifest (*Epistle*) is the Son of God who is born in our flesh. Yet, it is not His birth that saves us. So we beg Our Lord to cast the bright beams of His Christ light upon us (*Collect*) so we might hear, take to heart and live from the benefits of His birth, life, death and resurrection. The Apostle John is one of those who opens his mouth in our midst so that we might receive this spirit of wisdom and understanding (*Introit*). Through this Evangelist the Spirit teaches us that we do not die but live, because we are clothed in His glory and nourished by the Bread of Life which He is (*Old Testament*).

1 *John* 1:1-10


Beloved: That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the Word of life—the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us—that which we have

seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ. And we are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

This is the message we have heard from Him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in Him is no darkness at all. If we say we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His Word is not in us.




HOLY GOSPEL St. John 21:19-24
