The Theme of Today's Liturgy

Our Redeemer comes mightily, not to frighten you but to "cause His glorious voice to be heard" and to give you "gladness of heart" (*Introit*). He is "the Sun of Righteousness" who comes with healing in His wings (*Old Testament*). This is why we are told the signs of His coming so that "when these things begin to happen" we might "look up and lift our heads, because Our Lord will "stir up our hearts and to make ready the way of His only begotten Son" (*Collect*).

Parents of Small Children:




