








PSALMODY

FIRST READING Isaiah 12:1-6

Isaiah said: "In that day you will say: 'O LORD, I will praise You; though You were angry with me, Your anger is turned away, and You comfort me.

'Behold, God is my Salvation, I will trust and not be afraid; For YAH, the LORD, is my Strength and Song; He also has become my Salvation.'

Therefore with joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation. And in that day you will say: 'Praise the LORD, call upon His name; declare His deeds among the peoples, make mention that His name is exalted. Sing to the LORD, for He has done excellent things; this is known in all the earth. Cry out and shout, O inhabitant of Zion, for great is the Holy One of Israel in your midst!'"


THIRD READING John 16:5-15


Jesus said to His disciples: "Now I go away to Him who sent Me, and none of you asks Me, 'Where are You going?' But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your heart. Nevertheless I tell you the truth. It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you; but if I depart, I will send Him to you. And when He has come, He will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment: of sin, because they do not believe in Me; of righteousness, because I go to My Father and you see Me no more; of judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.








give us this day our daily bread;


and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us;


