FIRST READING

Numbers 21:4-9

The people of Israel journeyed from Mount Hor by the Way of the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; and the soul of the people became very discouraged on the way. 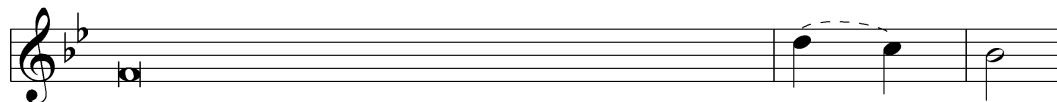
SECOND READING

James 1:22-27

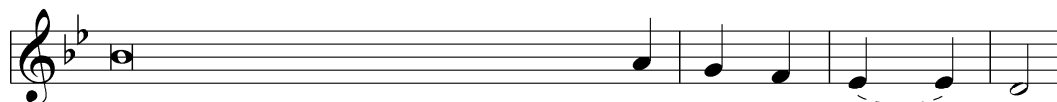
