# The Theme of Today's Liturgy

The Holy Church waits expectantly and eagerly for the Lord to come again just as the disciples saw Him go at His ascension. But she does not wait passively. Instead, the Church waits both seeking the Lord's face in prayer (*Introit*) and with the fervent love for each other that shows itself in a generous care-giving (*Epistle*). Therefore, the Faithful pray that they always have a devout will towards God and pure-hearted service (*Collect*). In this way they will suffer adversity. Yet they are not without the comfort of their God. For the Spirit of Truth comforts the Church in the faithful remembrance of our Lord's Word and Supper (*Gospel*).


